

Report of Celebration of Constitution Day (26th November,2020)


India's Constitution was adopted on November 26, 1949, and came into effect on January 26,1950. Government of India in 2015 decided to observe 26th November as 'Constitution Day' or 'Samvidhan Divas'. In this regard, a communication has been received from UGC to celebrate 'Indian Constitution Day' on 26th November, 2020.

Dr Rammanohar Lohia Avadh University celebrated the Constitution Day (Samvidhan Divas) on Thursday 26 November 2020 to mark the 71st Anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution of India at the Sant Kabir Auditorium, Dr Rammanohar Lohia Avadh University. The programme started with Maa Saraswati Vandana, Lighting of Lamps followed by recital of University Kulgeet and welcome address by Prof. Neelam Pathak. It was followed with Hon'ble VC Prof Ravi Shanker Singh's addressal who briefed the audience with the significance of Sambvidhan Divas. He described that the Indian Constitution, created after the huge self-churning, is the largest constitution in the world. After studying the constitutional systems of many democratic countries of the world, the framers of the Indian Constitution prepared it.

The book entitled **"Principle of Judicial Review in India"** authored by **Dr Ashok Kumar Rai (Dean Faculty of Law)** was released by Vice Chancellor Prof. Ravi Shankar Singh in the program. Addressing the audience in the program, Dr. Ashok Kumar Rai, explained the soul of the Constitution of India. The Court of Justice is active for the protection of constitutional values. Dr. Rai said that for the preservation of constitutional values, the Preamble of the Constitution should be implemented in the reading and learning in educational institutions.

During the event, the program organized by the government of India at the Kevadia, Gujarat was live telecasted. Hon'ble President of India addressed the nation and administered an oath to the Preamble of the Constitution of all. The pledge on preamble of Indian constitution was taken by all faculty and students.

In the evening a webinar on "Fundamental Principles of Indian Constitution" was organized. Prof. Neelam Pathak, Dean Student's welfare of the University gave introductory note to the occasion of Constitution Day to all the participants and attendees of the event and also introduced the chief guest of the event (Justice PK Srivastava, Retired High Court of Allahabad). Prof. Ravi Shankar Singh, vice-chancellor of the university presiding over the webinar, said that legislation has been established in India through the constitution. Retired Judge P. K. Srivastava of the High Court, Prayagraj Lucknow Bench, the Chief Guest of the webinar, stressed the acceptance of the Preamble of the Constitution as an important treatise for all Indians. Dr. Ashok Kumar Rai, Dean of Law in the program said that the Indian Constitution is like a religious book, every word of it is capable of assimilation. He called the principles of governance of law, separation of power, natural justice and judicial review, the fundamental soul of the Indian Constitution. The program was ended with National anthem.
